A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

The Apostle Paul once wrote to a church in the city of Ephesus and gave a simple, but powerful, word of encouragement. He said, "...find out what pleases the Lord" (Ephesians 5:10). This is to be the goal of our lives each day, and so over the last three years the Leadership Team and Pastoral Staff have been intentionally seeking to find out what pleases God in terms of His vision for our JCNaz family. We know from reading God's word that nothing pleases the Lord more than when people come to know Him as Savior and personally experience the new life He alone can give. In Luke 15, Jesus asked a question: "If you had 100 sheep and one of them got lost, won't you leave the 99 others to go and search for the one that is lost?" Jesus goes on to describe the joyful celebration that happens in heaven when one lost child of God comes home.



Sometimes the idea of leaving 99 safe sheep to go after one lost sheep seems too risky, and maybe even reckless to us. However, it's when we remember that all of us were lost and without hope at one time, that we are compelled to join Jesus' rescue operation with those around us. Research shows that over 18,000 people in our surrounding community are not connected with a local church. Last year, your leadership team started by personally praying for God to show us at least one person in our lives who needs to know the love of Jesus. We then committed to praying for that person and investing in that person's life as a friend. The truth is, there are lost and hurting people all around us – in our neighborhoods, in our schools, at our kids' extracurricular events, where we shop, and at our places of work. We believe God is calling all of us – everyone in our church family – to not only have a greater burden for those who don't know Jesus, but to rearrange our lives so that someday they will. Since God's heart is for the one, shouldn't our hearts be as well?

The God led and appointed leaders of JCNaz have prayed, fasted, sought wise counsel, and engaged in much conversation in order to discern God's leading and how we can be even more effective in our mission for Him in this season. Through this process, we've set some big faith goals over the next few years. We believe that extraordinary moves of God begin when ordinary people say "Yes" to Him in obedience. In order to see God's plans and purposes for us come to reality, we will need to give of ourselves and our resources.

The truth is, we are not called to sit on the sidelines, but to serve by getting on the front lines and being an active part of the most exciting work in the world – the work of pointing others to Jesus. I'm asking that each one in our church family take the time to sincerely seek God and ask Him what part He would have you to do in this initiative.

WHY HAVE A "ONE?"

God's word calls us all to "Go and make disciples of all nations..." (Matthew 28:19). That begins with everyone who believes in Jesus taking intentional time to purposefully help build God's kingdom by investing in the people around you.

You don't have to be a bible scholar, a stunning evangelist, or a pastor to do what Jesus did: love people, share the truth with them, and invest time in people that need God's love.

Simply put, we have a "ONE" because one person, one soul, one life being brought into God's kingdom is worth it! Jesus doesn't need us to bring an entire nation to Him, just one person who will bring another, who will bring another, until the whole world knows the love of our amazing God.

This person is not a project or something to be accomplished. They are someone you love and genuinely care about enough to not let them continue on a path that leads to destruction.

Your one should:

- 1) *Live locally*
- 2) *Not be a follower of Jesus*
- 3) *Be someone you intentionally rearrange your life to spend time with.*

Do life together, work together, raise kids together, eat meals together, and grow together. As that relationship is built, take opportunities to reveal the truth and love of Christ with them and invite them into eternal life with Christ. Why have a one? Because Jesus died for you, one person, so that you could live forever in Him: the greatest message in history! It is our great privilege to get to share that with those around us so they, too, may live!

While God has something amazing planned here for JCNaz, He also reminds us that His kingdom is meant for people over the entire world. We give here to our church, in order to be a blessing to our community, to engage with our nation, and to help build God's kingdom throughout the world. Pages in this book are color coded to show where the investments made will be impacting God's kingdom.

PERSONAL

Jesus wants us to grow individually in our relationship with Him. If we do not have a personally strong foundation in Him, it will be difficult to invest in those around us.

Philippians 1:6

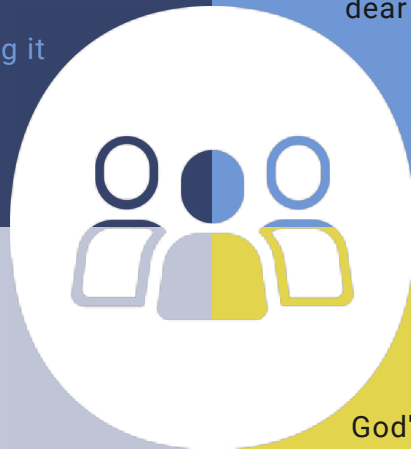

WEEK 1

ANYTHING'S POSSIBLE

Who's Your ONE? (please indicate the name or initials of the individual with whom you believe God is calling you to connect and for whom to pray)

SUNDAY, APRIL 24

Read Mark 5:1-20, the story of Jesus sending demons out of a man and into a herd of pigs that plunged over a steep bank into the lake. As you read this passage, answer this question, "Do I believe that with God anything is possible?"

- After the man from Gerasenes was free of the demons, he wanted to follow Jesus and be a disciple. But instead, Jesus sends him home so he could be a missionary to his town. What do you learn from the passage to help you realize how God can use you to reach your ONE?
- The dramatic end to the demons' power over the man demonstrates Jesus's ability to totally rule over demonic activity. What stands out to you from this passage and what about it did you find difficult?
- Reflect on the authority that Jesus demonstrated by speaking such words to force to the demons. How does that level of power fit with the image you have of Jesus? Does it change the way you think of him?

REFLECTION

Read the following scripture passages during the week and journal what they teach you about God and about people. Is there an example to follow, a command to obey, or a promise to keep?

WEEKLY PRAYER GUIDE

- Lord give me the courage and boldness to share Jesus with those around me.
Pray for:
 - Family
 - Friends
 - Coworkers
 - Those in your sphere of influence

- Lord I pray for the ONE you have brought to mind and in my life. Help me to be a true friend and to rearrange my life for my One whom you also died for.
Thank God ahead of time for:
 - Those He has/will put in your life
 - Opportunities to engage your one in true friendship

- Father, I come into your presence bringing to you my doubts, my fears, my cynicism and my mustard seed of faith that seem to be overshadowed by my current circumstance, need, or assignment.
Ask forgiveness for:
 - Having a lack of faith in some area of life (we all have them!)
 - A time this week when you were closed off the ways God wanted to change your heart

LIVING IT OUT

This week, pray God will give you the mindset throughout this week to see that there is nothing God won't do to reach the ONE. Remember there is no ONE he can't reach, transform or use. Look for ways you can meet a need for your ONE or an opportunity to connect.

WEEK 2

IT'S ALL ABOUT THE ONE

One person can make a tremendous difference. Think of the places you work, eat, study, run errands and live life. None of these things are by accident. God has put you there for a reason. How has God used you based on where you live or work?

SUNDAY, MAY 1

Read Luke 15:1-10. Here Jesus tells two parables: the parable of the lost sheep and the parable of the lost coin. In the first parable, the shepherd leaves 99 sheep to search for one lost sheep. In the second parable, a woman loses one coin and searches for it until it's found. Then she calls her friends and neighbors to come celebrate with her for finding that one coin.

- It may seem ridiculous that the shepherd would leave 99 sheep to search for one lost sheep. Yes, sheep were of high worth, but was one sheep that valuable? God's love for each person is so great that he seeks all who are lost. Have you built relationships with those who don't know Jesus?
- Lost people are simply people who haven't come into a relationship with God through faith in Jesus and haven't begun to actively follow Him. Remember that lost people are not a problem or project, but those who Christ died for as He did for us. Do you have a heart for those who are lost? Reflect on how you can act, be a friend to, and share Jesus with someone who doesn't know Him.
- The woman in the second parable celebrated with others when she found her lost coin. The angels in heaven also rejoice when one lost person puts their faith and trust in Jesus as Lord and Savior. With whom have you shared Jesus' love?

REFLECTION

Read the following scripture passages during the week and journal how you can make a difference in someone's life and follow Jesus' purpose.

WEEKLY PRAYER GUIDE

- Pray for God to give you a true and deep compassion for people who are lost that moves you to consistent action on their behalf.
Ask God to:
 - Give you HIS compassion for the lost
 - Reveal specific opportunities to show that compassion
- Pray that you will never compromise the gospel but that God would open the door so you can communicate the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ.
Praise God for:
 - His sacrifice on the cross through Jesus Christ
 - The opportunity He has given us to build His kingdom alongside Him
- Pray that God would give you the right attitude to love lost people.
Ask forgiveness for:
 - Ways in which we have lived our lives with a self-focus, rather than a focus on God and His mission to the lost
 - Times you have closed yourself off from investing in those around you who are lost

LIVING IT OUT

Loving lost people to Jesus takes time, attention, investment, patience, perseverance in prayer, diligence and effort. This week pray God will help you build relationships with those who are lost. Pray you will be ready to help those you encounter discover a real, personal, growing and producing relationship with the Lord.

WEEK 3

WHAT'S IN YOUR HAND?

What is the cost you believe the Lord is calling you to make in order to see your ONE to encounter the Savior?

SUNDAY, MAY 8

Read Mark 14:13-21, where the disciples opened their hands to the Lord to show they only had five loaves and two fish. As you read, ask the Lord to use what is in your hand to build the Kingdom of God.

- When it grew late, the disciples wanted to send the people away. However, Jesus wanted to teach them about the kingdom. What do you learn from the passage about the desire of God to use those who are willing but don't have much?
- What does this passage tell you about the disciple's perspective on the little they had and Jesus' perspective on how much they had to give?
- Do you believe God will bless and multiply what you have in your hand? Do you have the faith to trust Jesus to "feed your ONE" through your offering?

REFLECTION

Read the following scriptures throughout the week, ask the Lord to show you how these would work out in your life, in your home, in your workplace and in your neighborhood.

- Exodus 4:2-5
- Ephesians 3:14-21
- Mt. 25:14-30
- 1 Peter 4:10-11

WEEKLY PRAYER GUIDE

- Lord, help my fear to let go of my finances and allow you to guide me as a steward of the blessings you have given to me.
Thank God for:
 - All that He has given you in your life, no matter how small it may seem
 - The grace He freely gives us, even in our fears
- Lord, help me to open my hands to let you use what I have for your Kingdom.
Pray that God will:
 - Replace your will with His will
 - Teach you to release your grip on the things of this world in favor of His kingdom
- Lord, take the small amount I have and use it to change the life of my ONE.
Ask God how He can transform your:
 - Time
 - Resources
 - Knowledge

LIVING IT OUT

Reflect on how you will use your resources to build the God’s kingdom.

WEEK 4

"IF YOU SAY SO, I WILL!"

What will I do this week persistently, over and over, that I believe God will use to bring my ONE to Himself?

SUNDAY, MAY 16 ~ COMMITMENT SUNDAY

Read Luke 5:1-11, that's about Jesus calling the fishermen to do something they'd already been doing, but without results. And they were tired. But because Jesus asked them, they stepped out in absolute, surrendered obedience and put their nets out again. The results were more than Peter and his boat crew could even handle – they had to summon help. Soon after this, Jesus told them that they would be catching men rather than fish when they follow Him.

- Peter had many objections in this passage. Which ones do you use to avoid doing something Jesus is asking? What has God asked you to do in the past that didn't make sense?
- How did Peter overcome his objections? How did you overcome your concerns and do what you knew God wanted you to do?
- After the catch, Peter fell at Jesus feet in gratitude and awe. He realized it was nothing he'd done but only by God's power they caught the fish. It wasn't about Peter but about Jesus. This moment seems all about the trusting relationship Peter had with Jesus rather than the provision of fish. Are you seeking the gifts of God or the Gift of relationship with God more?
- What bigger mission is Jesus calling Peter (and us) to? (v. 11) "And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him." God desires to use each one of us in His mission to reach lost people. How does this story help us to understand what God is calling us to today?

WEEK 5

THE POWER OF ONE PURPOSE

God can do absolutely anything through one person (or one church) that is totally surrendered to the His purposes and willing to live life in radical obedience. What do you think is your purpose in life?

SUNDAY, JUNE 7

Read Acts 20:22-24 and Acts 21:1-14. As we look into this passage we see so clearly that the apostle Paul had one purpose! One purpose for getting out of bed every day and for living his life. Do you believe your life matters to God? Paul is saying so clearly, "My life here in this world is not about me...it's not about my happiness, my opinions, my comfort or getting what I want. Because when it's all said and done, I'm not living for myself! My life is all for God and His purposes.

- When we consider that God had a purpose for Paul and that purpose wasn't swayed by anyone's opinion, how does that challenge you as you reach out to your ONE?
- Paul did all he could to focus on God's purpose for him and what he was willing to risk even unto death: do you find this difficult? How did he rearrange his life to meet and live life with people?
- Consider the level of commitment of Paul. What does it take for that kind of commitment and how did his strong sense of purpose influence those around him?

WEEK 6

A WHATEVER IT TAKES CHURCH

We want to celebrate God’s faithfulness, leading, provision, and power at work within each of us individually, but also among us collectively, because we know that apart from Him we can do nothing. Reflect on how you have trusted God through this process and how he has led you in generosity.

SUNDAY, JUNE 7 ~ COMMITMENT SUNDAY

Read Luke 5:17-26. In this passage some men took a paralyzed man to Jesus to be healed. Because of the crowd in the house, these men carried their friend to the roof, took apart what was necessary to lower him in front of Jesus.

- These guys didn’t know what was going to happen. They didn’t know for sure how it was all going to end up, but they knew, “Hey something good is going to happen if we can just get our friend in front of Jesus! What impressed Jesus, the paralytic’s faith or the faith of his friends?
- Is this a part of your worry: “Well what if my unsaved friend doesn’t like the message, or they don’t understand everything that’s going on at church, or they hear something that makes them uncomfortable?” We don’t have to worry about all the what ifs...we just need to be willing to do our part. How can you overcome these fears?
- Are you committed to do whatever it takes to see friends come to know Jesus? Do you have the heart for those who need to encounter him? How do you know?
- These men who carried their friend to Jesus had the confidence that if they could just get their friend in front of Jesus, then He will do the rest. Do you have that kind of confidence in Jesus?

REFLECTION

Read the following scripture passages during the week and journal what they teach you about God and about people. Is there an example to follow, a command to obey, or a promise to keep? How do these verses challenge you to be a whatever it takes kind of Christ follower?

WEEKLY PRAYER GUIDE

- Ask God to help you live holy in Christ Jesus and help to have an attitude of obedience and trust in God's will.

- Pray that you will be wholly committed to God and effectively do his will of reaching and impacting more lives with the Good News of Jesus than you ever dreamed possible.
 - Ephesians 3:20
- Give thanks and rejoice for God's faithfulness, leading, and provision.

WE ARE GROWING!

- 1) Children's ministry has had massive growth over the last couple years.
- 2) Youth room is small for the increase in attendance over the last 2 years.
- 3) We need more rooms available for adult small groups and bible studies.

SCOPE OF PROJECT AND DETAILS

The key purpose of this initiative is to advance God's kingdom by investing in personal relationships here in JC. In order to help us accomplish this, our facilities are in need of renovation and finishing of un-utilized space to maximize the functionality of our facility.

The current unfinished side of the building will be fully renovated and constructed to become a more functional and secure children's area for the constantly growing children's ministry. This would absorb the current youth area and create a secure check in area for our little treasures.

This renovation would include larger spaces for each age level- infant through 6th grade- as well as a new gathering space for our children and families to engage them more as they experience the truth of Jesus.

So what about the old children's area?

Great question! The church offices would be able to remain where they are, and the current children's fellowship center, nursery, and foyer would become space for the youth to continue growing.

The classrooms along the back hallway would be simply remodeled and used to accommodate more adult classrooms, of which we are in need as we are out of space for groups to meet on Wednesday nights.

The bulk of the project cost would go to the unfinished side. The existing sites would get a face-lift to bring them into the 2020's.

The total cost of this project would be around \$1.5 Million. It may seem like a large number, but God has done great things in JC for the gospel before, He will work again!

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY

Washington Elementary school is located in Junction City at the north end of Washington Street.

Washington Elementary services a group of remarkable students! The staff and leadership of that school work tirelessly to equip their students with knowledge, skills, and relationships that will set them up for success throughout their education and as they launch into life.

This school services about 300 students, many of which qualify for free and reduced lunch programs.

Part of our tithe will be dedicated to helping their leadership and staff better meet the needs of their students. We will keep an ongoing partnership with the school to help build needed items, purchase student goods, support the teaching staff, or just simply be a blessing in whatever way we can.

Full details are not currently written, because we want to be responsive to the school's needs as they arise.



NATIONAL PARTNERSHIP: KIDS AGAINST HUNGER

KAH provides a great opportunity to invite others to help build the food pouches and they allow us as a church to choose where the food is shipped to!

Kids Against Hunger (KAH) is an organization dedicated to feeding the hungry around the world and around the corner. JCNaz hosts a packing event by providing money to purchase the ingredients and KAH would be responsible for bringing the ingredients and packing supplies to our location and then supervise the process. Meals can then be stored for local use, shipped somewhere in the country, or sent overseas!

At the present time meals cost thirty cents each. The minimum amount KAH will pack is 10,000 meals or \$3000.00 dollars. Ingredients for the meals are rice, soy protein, dried vegetables and a vitamin/chicken flavoring powder. The meals are assembled via a packing line, weighed then vacuum sealed in 6 meal units, and loaded into cartons holding 216 meals.

The time it takes to pack 10 thousand meals would depend on the number of workers JCNaz could provide. Many have used this as an outreach to include friends and neighbors to the work Christ called us to do. The more people involved, the more meals we will be able to package and the larger blessing we will get to be!

WORLD PARTNERSHIP MISSIONS TRIPS

We are already equipped with a Missions Director and a missions team here at JCNaz. They will take the lead on this partnership!

If you have ever been on a mission trip in the US or abroad, you know that it is a life changing experience. To serve others in a way that meets their need not only fills you with genuine joy, but a satisfaction in the knowledge that your actions have directly improved the life of others.

In the past JCNaz has sent teams to Haiti, North Carolina, and Texas. We also directly support several missionaries in the field, and offer pastoral training for pastors in eastern Europe.

Our Missions Director would work with their team to find opportunities for JCNaz members to join in God's mission outside of Junction City.

We don't want to limit God's plan for us in this, so as of the writing of this booklet we do not have a specific trip in mind. As God moves and speaks, we want to listen, and be able to take our church family to where God needs us to be.

This fund will provide financial resources for those who may not usually be able to join in missions because of financial constraints.

WHAT IS THE PROJECTED COST OF THIS PROJECT AND HOW WILL IT BE FUNDED?

Our church architecture and design company (RisePointe) has estimated a total project cost of \$1,500,000. We will invite everyone who calls JC NAZ their church home to make a financial commitment above their regular giving in order to help bring this vision to reality. These total commitments will be given over a period of three years. Our goal for this initiative is to raise \$750,000. Our elected church leadership team recommends that we fund the remainder of the project by taking out a loan with the goal of repaying it as quickly as possible. The more we are able to raise during the three year initiative the less we will need to take out as a loan.

IS IT WISE FOR US AS A CHURCH TO TAKE ON DEBT?

Our leadership team and those who oversee our finances have set a boundary that we are not allowed to acquire any debt greater than three times our annual budget raised. This enables us maintain financial margin while funding plans such as this without hurting current ministry and outreach. Last year income collected for all purposes came to \$698,616.00. Using this figure we would be allowed by our by-laws to take out a maximum loan of approximately two million dollars. The amount we are projecting will need financing for is considerably under this amount.

IS NOW A GOOD TIME TO BE TAKING ON A PROJECT OF THIS SIZE?

While we are not unaware of the current challenges and issues impacting us on a local and global level and the added concern this creates for individuals and families, we also believe the Lord is leading us in this endeavor. While we want to exercise good, godly wisdom, we never want to operate as a church out of what we can do easily or safely on our own. Every time God asked someone to do something significant in the Bible, it required the courage to take a risk and take God at His word even when they couldn't see and didn't understand. Throughout the entire 95 year history of our church, God has led us to make moves that didn't seem to make sense in the natural, but each time the church responded in obedience, the Lord has shown Himself faithful.

DO WE ACTUALLY NEED MORE SPACE?

We are incredibly blessed with an abundance of space in which to do ministry. The goal of this project is not necessarily to gain more space, but to restructure ministry space to most effectively meet current and future ministry needs. In addition, with this strategy three important ministries in our church will benefit greatly (children, youth and small groups/discipleship). This approach allows us to build a true master plan for future growth needs. It's been approximately 15 years since we've done any major remodeling and a having a fresh, updated ministry area will not only be more effective, but also much more inviting and welcoming to new guests as well as current attenders.
